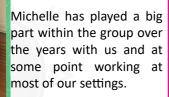

We Bring the Indoors Out!

Kids Collective understand the importance of a balanced and healthy diet for the children in our care. Having achieved the Health Setting accreditation, we understand that in getting it right, you cannot go wrong. All our menus are submitted to a dietitian to analyse, and this ensures that we can offer the children a nutritionally balanced meal or light tea, alongside fresh fruit and vegetable crudites, while spending time having fun and trying out new activities. Water and hydration are also important so the children have access to fresh water during their time with us and are encouraged, through role modelling to enjoy. To diversify the selection on offer we consider individual likes and dislikes during our regular reviews and make changes accordingly. Menus are displayed for parents and children to view, and copies are available on request.

To enhance knowledge and understanding of the importance of healthy eating and nutrition, the children take part in baking and cooking activities during their time at Club. By using lots of different recipes, maximising the use of a wide variety of fruit and vegetables they begin to develop a comprehensive understanding of a balanced and healthy diet.

Within the schools we operate from, we are very fortunate to have access to large outdoor playgrounds, along with a selection of large outside equipment. Physical exercise plays a vital role in our clubs, and in the development for the children. We understand that children need to run off steam during the day, while at school and club, and for this reason we have an "outside all weather" ethos, with suitable clothing, children are encouraged to access the outdoor space as much as possible and enjoy the fresh air and activities available. Activities become big and games can be played on a much larger scale, as the children thrive in this environment.

The eatwell guide – NHS website is an excellent resource for parent to explore offering advice on recipes, diet and nutrition, enabling them to make small changes which make a big difference.

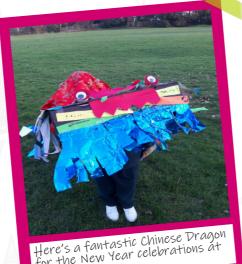
